

ORDER

AND NOW, this 12th day of February, 2010, upon consideration of the pro se submission by Bianca Lozada, which she refers to as "notice of Objection to Referee Howard K. Goldstein's disposition of my POC," considered by the court as an Exception taken to the Referee proceedings, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, in view of the fact that the Referee has not yet submitted to the Court a Report and Recommendation and any Exception is therefore premature, the EXCEPTION IS DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE.

Further, Bianca Lozada is hereby directed to provide to the Referee any requested documentation he requires in order to determine the merits or the value of her claim. In the event that additional documentation sufficient to make a determination on Lozada's Objection to the Liquidator's Notice of Determination

is not provided to the Referee on or before March 26, 2010, the Objection may be subject to dismissal with prejudice.¹
