ORDER

AND NOW, this 15th day of October, 2002, having considered the
uncontested Petition for Relief from Stay filed on behalf of Local Union No.
630 of the United Association of Journeyman and Apprentices of the
Plumbing and Pipe Fitting Industry of the United States and Canada, AFL-
CIO, Trustees of the Local 630 Pension-Annuity, Health and Welfare, and
Apprenticeship Trust Funds, and the Trustees of the Plumbers and Pipefitters
National Pension Fund, and the response filed thereto by M. Diane Koken as
Liquidator for Reliance Insurance Company, said petition is **GRANTED** for
the limited purpose of seeking clarification of the status of the stay.
With the exception or paragraph 22 of the Liquidation Order dated October
3, 2001, all stays imposed by this Court in the above-captioned matter have
expired; currently, with the exception of paragraph 22 of the Liquidation
Order dated October 3, 2001, there is no stay in effect in the Commonwealth

of Pennsylvania that pertains to the Liquidation of Reliance Insurance Company.

Further, there is no requirement that service be made upon those listed on the Master Service List.
